Product Purpose or Use

1. The product certified for use as a termite management treatment for concrete, mortar, render and other masonry surfaces is designed to create a termite resistant area to the surfaces to which it is applied and to create the inspection zone as defined in AS3660.1:2014.
2. The product is registered for application, to external concrete, mortar, render and other masonry surfaces and is approved to be applied within the wall cavity below damp proof course, in buildings constructed with a monolithic or concrete slab conforming to AS 2870:2011 on footing construction.

Subject to the following Conditions & Limitations:

- a. Only to be installed by an accredited Termcoat installers.
- b. Product installation shall be carried out in accordance with the Termcoat Installation Manual (Version 1 2015).
- c. In accordance with BCA 2015 Volume One: B1.4 (i)(ii) (including NT state variation) and BCA 2015 Volume Two: 3.1.3.2(b) (Qld Variation 3.1.3.2 (a) (b)) a durable notice must be permanently fixed to the building in a prominent location, such as a meter box or the like indicating:
 - (i) The method of termite risk management; and
 - (ii) The date of installation of the systems; and
 - (iii) Where a chemical barrier is used, its life expectancy as listed on the National Registration Authority APVMA Label (#64218); and
 - (iv) The installer's or manufacturers recommendations for the scope and frequency of future inspections for termite activity.
- d. When used as a termite barrier in conjunction with a concrete slab the slab must be designed and constructed according to AS 2870: 2011 or AS 3600: 2009 (including amendment 1, as per BCA 2015).
- e. When used as a termite barrier on mortar or render the mortar joint under the barrier shall be full (have no gaps or porosity to provide an inspection zone).
- f. Regular inspections of the 75mm inspection zone are to be undertaken by a Licenced Pest Controller in accordance with AS 3660.2-2000 and AS 4349.3-2010 to determine that no bridging or breaching of the Termcoat treatment has occurred
- g. This product is excluded from use against *mastotermes darwiniensis*.
